Mentor Matching Engine (MME) is for STEM professionals and academics who want to support high school students in projects that go beyond the classroom.

MME is an online platform for project-based virtual mentorship that connects you with students and their teachers seeking project-based STEM mentorship.

Mentors act both as the content and field expert and a guide through the research and design process. It's unlike traditional mentoring because it breaks down transaction costs and geographic barriers.


